

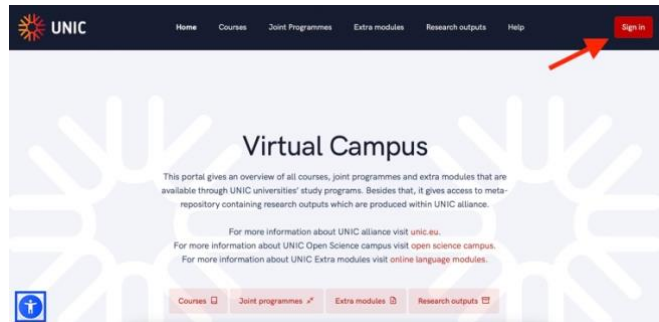
## Virtual Campus Registration Guide

This is a step-by-step guide to help you register to the [UNIC Virtual Campus](https://unic.srce.hr/unicvc/), a shared platform designed to facilitate courses, joint programmes, and to connect researchers across all ten UNIC universities. The Platform's Matchmaking Algorithm allows you to easily find colleagues working on similar topics and exploring potential collaborations.

- Go to the following link and click on the sign-in button to start your registration:

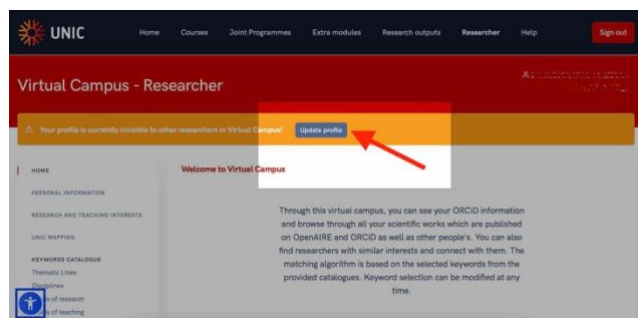
- Log in with your university credential.



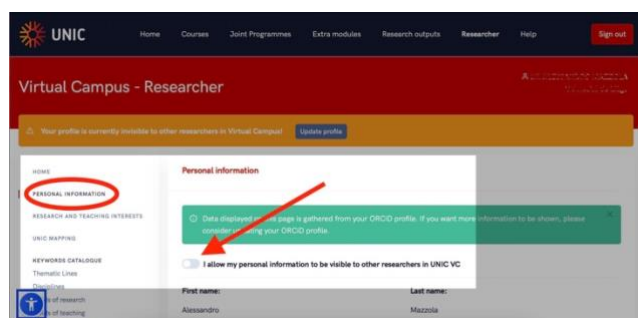
- Complete your basic information. When you select your role as a researcher, the system will require you to **link your ORCID profile by using your ORCID 16-digit iD**. In case you don't have an ORCID profile, you can create one here: <https://orcid.org>.

- Once your profile is created in the Virtual Campus, your registration will be confirmed within 24h.

- Once your registration is confirmed (within 24h), log back in to the VC and click on the update profile button.



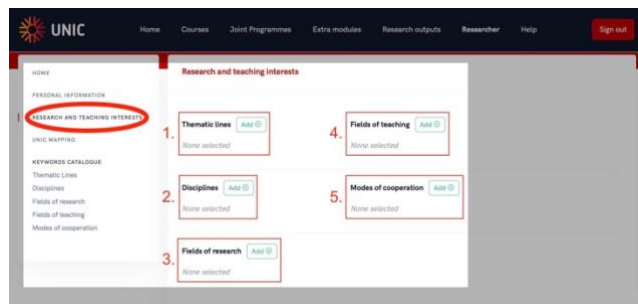
- In your Personal Information page, please **allow your personal information to be visible** by clicking on the toggle switch.



In order for your profile to be searchable in the UNIC Matchmaking Platform, you need to complete it by selecting keywords in the Research and Teaching Interests page.

There are 5 different categories of keywords you can select to help tailor your matchmaking:

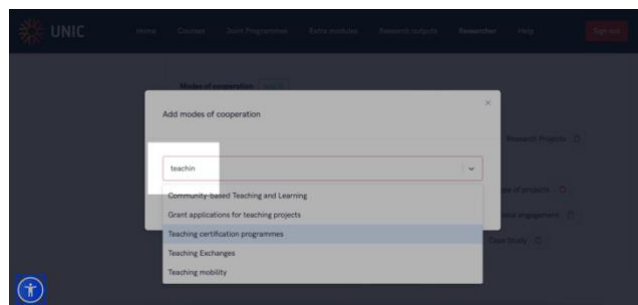
1. Thematic Lines
2. Disciplines
3. Fields of Research
4. Fields of Teaching
5. Modes of Cooperation



You can add keywords for each category by clicking on the button:

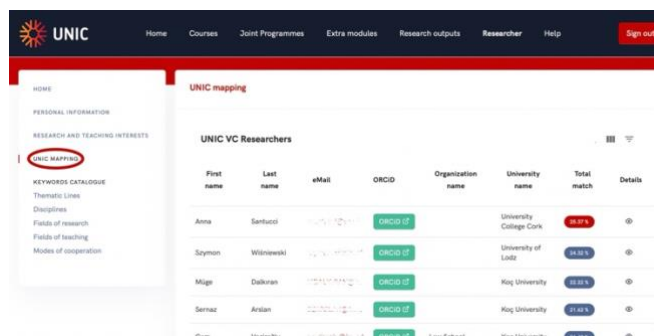


You can choose keywords from the drop-down menu for each category, or use the typing function to facilitate your keyword selection. Please consider to pick the most relevant keywords and/or the ones that are closest to your profile.



Please note that under **Thematic Lines** you can indicate the UNIC community of scholars you would like to be in contact with. There are 7 different Thematic Line communities in UNIC. You will find more information at: <https://www.unic.eu/fr/thematic-lines>.

Finally, under the UNIC Mapping tab, you will be able to visualize and identify researchers with similar interests, using detailed mapping tools.
