Q: What kind of courses will be offered to exchange students?

A: Available courses will differ depending on your score of a language level check test. You are required to take the designated test in advance. JLPT N1 holders will be able to select more regular courses that they desire to take. Besides, Language Center offers Japanese language lectures such as “Japanese”, “Japan Studies” and “Japanese Communication” especially for exchange students with intermediate Japanese level or below.

Q: I am worried about my Japanese language skill.

A: Language Center offers Japanese language lectures designed to fit a language proficiency and academic history of each exchange students. No need to worry too much. Also, LC offers “Japanese academic counseling system” as a learning support for international students. Students can take a private or group session with a counselor for free. In the session, counselors can take care of problems you got at a class or daily life, a proofreading of your assignment or report and study for JLPT/BJT.

Q: Is there any opportunity to get acquaintances with Japanese students?

A: Yes, there is. International students can join “Matching system” in which international students and Japanese students teach their languages and cultures each other in a pair or a group. Their relationships sometimes continue even after graduation. And, there are many places where international students can mingle with Japanese students inside campus; such as Asia space and English space in Ariake campus / International communication space in Musashino campus. They have a lunch or study together there everyday.

Q: Will I get support for any trouble happened at MU and where should we go?

A: International Relations Office (IRO) will take care of your campus life continuously after classes start. IRO will have an opportunity for you to talk about your situation and share your problems if any through a meeting held in the middle of each semester.

Q: Is there any events for international students?

A: There is an organization managed by and for international students in MU. You can

communicate with each other and join or even plan events like BBQ. And also, there are many senior students whom you can consult with.

Q: How many international students are there in MU?

A: 600-700 international students are studying at MU. They account for as much as a tenth of that of all students in MU. Students come from various countries.
